Recommendation to postpone the purchase of a new dive boat: It was recommended that we continue to put money away for a future boat purchase with the understanding that a DNR grant is available for 50% of the cost, but because of diver availability purchase should be postponed to a future date. Dan Mehring asked if the boat grant will be available in the future. Greg Nevinski asked if something happened to the boat are we in the position of being able to purchase a boat at that time. The current boat fund is \$16,321 and is projected to be \$19,624 in 2024. No vote was necessary for this agenda item.

There are companies who provide this type of service on other Wisconsin Lakes. Dale Smith asked if there is a way to determine why the milfoil is more abundant this year and if the divers can provide some additional information about what they are seeing under water.
